Local Man Slain After Leaving Bar

A 52-year-old executive was found stabbed to death on a west side lawn early Saturday, April 8. Police said initially that he had been killed about a block away and then dumped from a car.

Subsequent reports revealed that Michael Uso Guevara, of Gardendale, was last seen at Mt. Chalet Lounge, 14000 W. McNichols at 2:20 a.m. Saturday, when he left accompanied by a young man who was going for a ride with him in a 1977 Cadillac owned by Guevara's boss. Homicide Sgt. Richard Ridling was quoted in a Detroit paper as stating that the victim was stabbed by 20-year-old Napoleon Jackson because he wanted to steal the car.

Jackson was arraigned following his identification by Mt. Chalet evening manager Bob Kose in a police line-up

on the day following the murder. Police were led to Jackson when they found the stolen car and arrested its driver, who told them he got the vehicle from Jackson.

Kose reported that before Guevara left the bar he took him aside and cautioned him, stating, "I don't know this fellow; I have no idea what kind of person he is." Guevara ignored the warning and left the bar with Jackson. Kose checked the parking lot 10 minutes later and verified that the car was not there. Three hours later Guevara's body was found on a lawn near W. Outer Drive and Ardmore. He had suffered four stab wounds and apparently bled to death.

On April 19, Jackson was arraigned and bound over for trial on charges of first degree murder and grand larceny. He is in jail without bond pending trial
