Love will find no limits.

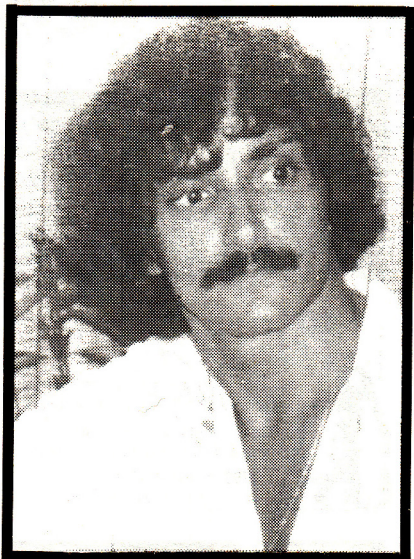
*Return to the Light, if you but

Dan-Michael Vigliarolo was born in Dearborn, Michigan on February 8, 1952. His family moved to Livonia where he completed high-school. The theater was one of his many interests. This led to his involvement in drag shows. Besides performing himself, he helped others to develop their personas which was appreciated.

After high-school, he attended MSU and



studied music and theater. Before graduating however, he decided that hair-dressing would be more profitable. He operated a beauty shop in west Detroit under the pseudonym, Danni Vegas.

His parents both died within a year of each other when he was twenty- seven. This, combined with other personal tragedies prompted his decision to sell everything and start over in Florida. He lived eight years in Key West. In 1982, he moved to Virginia before returning to Michigan.

He managed several Lawson stores and the Country Video Store (TNT) before moving on to Metra Magazine as a writer and managing editor. He continued in this position as long as his health permitted.

After being diagnosed HIV + in 1988, he became active in Friends Alliance where he served on the board. Subsequently, he served as president of Positive Living Network until he decided to direct his attention more toward personal growth.

On February 15, 1993, after a period of debilitation and brief illness, he passed away from AIDS.

His caring, though sometimes temperamental presence will certainly be missed in our community.
