## Ed Walker

Edward J. Walker, partner/owner of the Hayloft Saloon in Detroit died on August 24, 1993 of liver failure complications.

Walker collapsed in his Detroit home on Tuesday, August 24 and was rushed to the hospital where he died shortly after his arrival there. He was 49.

Born in Highland Park, Michigan on October 24, 1944, Walker grew up in the Dearborn Heights area. After high school he entered the U.S. Army and served for two years. His stint with the army included a tour of duty in Vietnam where he was wounded in battle and was awarded a Purple Heart.

After the military Walker worked for ten years as a assembler for the Ford Motor Company. For the past twelve years he has been partner/owner of the Hayloft Saloon on Detroit's westside.

Bowling and shooting pool were his hobbies and he had bowled on teams in both the Tuesday Night Mixed Bowling League and the BTI Sunday Bowling League.

Survivors include his lover of twentythree years Len Lippert, a sister, three brothers, several nieces and nephews, and many patrons and friends.
